

STATUTE OF THE STUDENT PARLIAMENT

from 6. 12. 2023

The Student Parliament is a space for students to be involved in school life. It supports students' responsibility for their own education and enables them to participate in the running of the school. Representatives of the student parliament meet regularly at working meetings, where they present suggestions and comments from their classmates on the educational process, the school environment, and mutual coexistence. The student parliament submits suggestions, questions, and proposals to the school management, teachers, and classmates in their core classes. They try to find optimal solutions together. The student parliament is a means of transferring information between all classes and promotes cooperation between individual grades. The activities of the student parliament are part of the priorities of the school educational program. They strive to fulfill the school's goals in the areas of personal and social education and the education of a democratic citizen. The work of the student parliament is based on the content of the Convention on the Rights of the Child, which was adopted on November 20, 1989 by the UN General Assembly and to which the Czech Republic also acceded.

According to this Convention, the child has the right to:

- express his/her opinion and make requests,
- measures that ensure discipline in school is consistent with human dignity,
- to protection against discrimination,
- obtain and publish information.

The student parliament focuses its activities on:

- improving each student's attitude towards schoolwork, mutual assistance between students,
- hygiene and safety at school, assistance in ensuring cleanliness and order with the aim of eliminate indifference and disinterest,
- participation in organizing the running of the school.

The Student Parliament has the duty to:

- cooperate with the school management, teachers and other school employees through their representatives, while adhering to the school's binding rules,
- respect social rules and observe principles of good behavior,
- take care of the school's tradition and maintain its good reputation,
- accept full moral responsibility for its initiatives,
- be a representative of the school.

The Student Parliament has the right, in particular:

- express its opinions on school problems and extracurricular activities,
- actively participate in all aspects of school life,
- present its suggestions to the school management and teachers.

The goals of the student parliament:

1. Facilitate the exchange of information between students, teachers, school management, and school staff.
2. Prevent negative phenomena such as bullying, harming others, or the destruction of school property.
3. Remind students to follow school rules.
4. Help organize class events.
5. Address student's comments and suggestions for improving the school's operations.
6. Present its work in the school magazine and on the school website.

Statutes of the Student Parliament of the School:

1. The Student Parliament is elected as a whole once a year, always at the beginning of the school year.
2. Two representatives are elected from each class in grades 3-9.
3. Nomination for elections to the student parliament is subject to the consent of the class teacher, who, when assessing the nominees, takes into account primarily compliance with the obligations of students in general and compliance with the obligations and goals of the student parliament, in particular compliance with school rules, respect for social rules and adherence to the principles of decent behavior.
4. In the case of a proposal from the class collective or by decision of the class teacher, one or both representatives from the student parliament may be dismissed during the school year and a new representative may be elected. Here too, the nomination is subject to the consent of the class teacher.
5. The Student Parliament meets at least once every 14 days or as needed.
6. The Student Parliament is convened by its chairman in cooperation with the coordinators.
7. Two teachers are entrusted by the school management with coordinating the work of the Student Parliament.
8. Minutes are taken of each meeting of the Student Parliament and posted on the notice board and on the school website.
9. Other interested persons may attend meetings of the Student Parliament as guests by prior arrangement.

Rules of conduct in the student parliament:

1. We listen to others and respect their different opinions.
2. We try to find a way to get along with others, we interact with respect.
3. We actively participate in solving problems at school. We help create stimulating school environment.
4. We pass on unbiased information from our meetings to school management, teachers and classmates.
5. We attend meetings regularly and arrive on time.
